ELECTIVES

Campers will be given the opportunity to participate in, and enjoy, two 45-minute classes in various art disciplines each afternoon. Because the number of spaces per discipline is capped, it is important to note that campers will be placed on a first-come, first-served basis as applications are received.

Campers are asked to prioritize the following electives (numbers 1-5) in provided boxes. Please fill in ALL five boxes. While it is our intention to provide each camper with their first and second choices, this may not be possible if the resulting requests exceed the number of spaces allowed per discipline. Applications with no elective selections will be placed where spaces are available.

ART. (max. 15 students) For the students who are interested in exploring the discipline of visual arts. One or two projects will be introduced for students to work on during their week at camp. The final results of these art projects will be put on display for parents to view at the final concert on the last day of camp.
DRAMA (IMPROV.) (12-15 students) Come learn the basics of improv. with performer and former Second City instructor, Jennine Profeta. You'll laugh! You won't cry! Campers will participate in hands-on, laugh-a-minute games and exercises that build confidence while focusing on fundamentals such as teamwork and the power of "Yes And". No experience necessary.
JAZZ COMBO (7-9 students) Specifically for the more advanced players, this elective is comprised of rhythm and horn sections and teaches techniques for music improvisation and small ensemble playing in a jazz setting. Join jazz specialist, Scott Marshall, and "let's lay down some grooves."
DANCE (max. 12 students) With professional dancer, Caroline Bentley, this dance elective will focus on the urban style of Hip-Hop, while introducing different ways of moving along with components of composition and creation. This is a very important aspect of dance as it enriches creativity, imagination and encourages the freedom of dance in everyone's unique way.
HAND BELLS (max. 10 students) Come and learn how to play these amazing instruments. Campers will be taught the proper technique required to produce the optimal tonal quality. This is an amazing opportunity for campers to experience the beautiful sounds of a hand bell choir. With a bell in each hand, students will be exposed to basic reading of basic, standard hand bell music while working along side others as a "team" to create a bell choir. No experience is necessary and instruments will be provided.
UKULELE (max. 8-10 students) This elective introduces the students to the basics of learning how to play the ukulele and teaching some basic tunes with potential for performing in the final concert. No experience is necessary and instruments will be provided.

BEGINNING INSTRUMENTAL INSTRUCTION

This program is only open to students who are entering grade five, six or seven in September 2023 and have never played a band instrument. This program will be limited to the first 30 applicants.

Students in this program will be taught the basics of learning a band instrument starting with instrument assembly, proper playing positions and techniques, and reading of musical notes and rhythms. As a group, these players will form a band and perform beginning level repertoire.

This group of students will join other campers in activities such as electives, sports and the Finale group.

The introduction and objective of this program is to compensate the students for such school programs where music was cancelled during the pandemic. The objective is to expose them to the wonderful experience of playing an instrument and giving them a kick-start to the school music programs in September.
